### Message from the Headteacher

As we near the end of a busy and unconventional first term, I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you for your continued support of the school. The COVID19 pandemic has effected many areas of society including the way school operates day to day. Meden staff have worked tirelessly to ensure that students are safe and are able to access our full curriculum. School life has of course continued and we have seen many successes and highlights throughout these 15 weeks. Whilst it is not easy to capture everything our staff and students have achieved, I hope to give you a flavour.

Y11 have been working tirelessly this term, accessing intervention, supporting them to achieve their true and full potential. With less than 100 days left until the summer exams, students will continue to work hard with their teachers and tutors, ensuring they feel fully prepared. All Y11 and Y10 students now have access to an online platform, GCSE pod, allowing them to independently learn and revise a large number of subjects. Historically, students who access GCSE pod, significantly improve their GCSE results. Meden teachers are using this to support learning during their lessons. In the New Year, students in Years 11 and 13, will be working hard towards their GCSE and A level exams. With the support of our staff, students will be encouraged to achieve all of their ambitions, feeling motivated to succeed.

Another highlight for me was the school's contribution to Remembrance Day. 122 Poppies, created in Design & Technology by our students, represented each of the Warsop residents who sadly lost their lives in service. Complementing this, a group of year 9 students produced a stunning mural as a backdrop to the poppies and produced some excellent remembrance pebbles. This served as a fitting reminder to our students of the debt we owe to those who serve us, not only in the First and Second World Wars but also other conflicts around the globe.

In November, Y8 Students celebrated National Engineering week, exploring the contribution made by engineers towards the development of space travel. Students took part in a number of exciting activities, including the manufacture of a model of the Ariana 4 space rocket and researching amazing facts about space. It was great to see how engaged students were throughout the week, highlighting the huge potential our students have at Meden!

This year has seen the exciting return of Music back onto our curriculum. Mrs Archdale, our new music teacher, has been so impressed with the students and their musical ability. The music department has been fully renovated over the summer months, allowing students to take advantage of all the new equipment, ranging from drum kits to keyboards and a whole army of ukuleles! Students have embraced the chance to show us their musical talents and it is great to see them flourish in music lessons.

In PE, staff have worked closely with students to help develop their leadership skills, such an important area in the development of our students, beyond their academic studies. Y10 Students have been supported by the "Mansfield School Sports Partnership" to achieve a national sport leadership award. Students have been working tenaciously to become the best leaders they can be, encouraged by our PE staff, becoming more confident, outgoing individuals.

## My Tutor

Meden is working with a company called, 'MyTutor' with Year 11 students. MyTutor matches students with a kind and friendly tutor who is studying at a top university somewhere in the UK. The tutors are talented, bright, and have recently sat their GCSEs and A Levels, so they understand how stressful exams can be. Lessons take place online in an, 'interactive lesson space', where our students are able to see, hear and chat with the tutors. These tutors are helping our students develop their skills and knowledge in maths, English and science. Evidence shows that, with regular attendance, MyTutor lessons can help students gain confidence in their subject and improve by 1 whole grade, after just 10 weeks. The students who have taken part so far have really enjoyed the experience and feel that the one to one support is really



helping them to deepen their knowledge or understand things that they were not confident with before. The willingness of our students to engage with this has been exemplary. They have shown courage and determination and are committed to being the very best they can be.

'The student did amazing today. She kept up with the fast pace of the session and was engaged as always.



# Remembrance Day



# **Tomorrows Engineers Week**

The week from 2nd-6th of November was "Tomorrows Engineers Week". This week is intended to celebrate the work of engineers in the past and encourage students to consider engineering as an area for them to work in in the future. Within D&T lessons it was celebrated with a number of activities relating to the work of engineers in making space travel a reality. Students investigated the ways in which engineers have contributed to enabling space travel and the ways in which this space travel impacts each of our day to day lives. They discussed ideas about how they thought space travel might change our lives in the future and modelled the Ariana 4 space rocket. For homework students had to find an 'amazing space fact'. The favourite amazing space fact that was found was that:

"Our galaxy is called the Milky Way and it would take 200000 years to cross it travelling at the speed of light (186282 miles per second!). There are about 100 thousand million stars in just this one galaxy, (the Milky Way) and yet scientists believe there are more galaxy's in the known universe than there are stars in the Milky Way!!"

### **SPORTS LEADERSHIP**

The aim of CORE PE within KS4 is for students to develop a lifelong interest in one element of sport and physical activity. In year 10, students get to choose an option block of activities ranging from competitive games, creative, health related fitness and leadership. This year we have been extremely fortunate to link up with the Mansfield School Sports Partnership for the leadership option, whereby students that have opted for the leadership block, are completing a leadership award. So far, students have completed a theory lesson on the skills and qualities needed to



be a good leader and an introductory session where they took it in turns to lead each other through a range of physical challenges. Over the next six weeks, students will be developing different physical challenges for primary school children to encourage participation in different physical activities and sports. These challenges will be collated into a video and shared with all primary schools in the area for students to complete the 'Mega Meden Challenge' in January. Following the release of the challenge, we hope that students will then be able to go into the local primary schools and deliver their PE lessons and after school clubs using the leadership skills they have developed.
