A religion is a set of beliefs that is held by a group of people. There are many	
different religions, each with a different set of beliefs. The beliefs are about	
the world and the people in it, about how they came into being, and what their	
purpose is. These beliefs are often linked to supernatural beings such as God, a	
number of gods or spirits.	
What aspects make up a religious group?
