Homework is given as part of a 3 week cycle

1. Week 1 – create flashcards
2. Week 2 – look, say, cover, write check (using the flashcards created in week 1)
3. Week 3 – Brain dump - a check to see how much you have learned

On week 1 of every cycle, you will be emailed the work to learn which are usually key words for that subject. We will also upload them to the website (Homework) and to MCAS under Important Documents. The point of the homework is to teach students how to revise effectively and to build up key vocabulary for each of their core subjects.

Here is the work per subject for this 3 week cycle

ENGLISH – Learn the following key words

Poetry	Metaphor	A figure of speech that directly refers to one thing by mentioning another
	Tenor/vehicle/ground	Tenor – the object/thing/person you want to describe Vehicle – the object/thing/person you compare the tenor to Ground – the characteristics the tenor and vehicle share
	Topic sentence	The sentence of a paragraph that contains your main idea

SCIENCE – Learn the following key words

Practical Vocab	Accurate	A result that is very close to the true answer.
	Precise	When are the data is close to the mean.
	Resolution	The smallest change a measuring instrument can detect.

MATHS – Learn the following key words

Multiplying & dividing	Multiplying and dividing negative numbers	Examples: $-6 \times -7 = 42$ $-6 \times 7 = -42$ $30 \div -6 = -5$

	Decimal multiplication (mentally)	Examples: $0.6 \times 0.4 = 0.24$ $6 \times 0.4 = 2.4$ https://corbettmaths.com/2013/02/15/multiplying-decimals-2/

	Horn of Africa	A region in East Africa that includes the countries of Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, and Somalia.
	Misconception	A view or opinion that is incorrect because it is based on faulty thinking or understanding.

Medieval Life	Feudal system	A system where land is passed down and loyalty is given upwards.
	Significance	Something that is important and/or has an impact.
	Trial by ordeal	Criminal trial in which the guilt or innocence was determined by dangerous or painful tests (as submersion in water) believed to be under God's control.
