At Meden School we believe that examination success allows our students to make the very most of their lives and student achievement is at the very heart of everything we do.


We have developed a curriculum designed to challenge and engage students, offering them the very best preparation for examination success and the skills and confidence required to make full use of those qualifications.

HOUSE SYSTEM

Every student at Meden School belongs to a house.

We are aware that moving to a large secondary school from a small primary school can sometimes feel like very big step. Belonging to a house helps our students feel part of a smaller community within the larger whole school community, providing a place of security, support and friendship.

Sharing a house with fellow pupils gives an ideal opportunity to learn about the values of tolerance, support, courtesy and friendship. It is no coincidence that some of the strongest life-long friendships are made within houses.

To emphasise the feeling of belonging to a team, our school uniform identifies students as belonging to the school community, but each house has its own tie with stripes to match the house colours. This ensures that every student is instantly recognisable as belonging to a particular house.

Each house logo is made up of a different element of the Meden School badge. A variety of designs were presented to the Student Council so that they could choose their favourite design.

CURRICULUM

Our curriculum follows National Curriculum guidelines and aims to provide a broad, balanced learning experience for all.

At Key Stage 3, our two-year programme covers all the National Curriculum subjects. Students are taught in ability groups in the majority of subjects, ensuring that every child is taught at a level that matches their ability.

There is a three-year programme for Key Stage 4. All students study a core consisting of English, Mathematics, Science, Physical Education and Religious/Personal/Social/Health Education. All students must study at least one subject from; a language, History, Geography or Computer Science. This is supplemented by a wide range of optional subjects, including Media, Technology and Health and Social Care.

We expect most of our students to achieve at least eight passes at grades 9–1 (with some subjects still grading at A*–G for another year), including English and Mathematics. Every student is actively encouraged to work towards the new English Baccalaureate standard, invaluable for university applications.

Meden College offers a range of pathways for students to continue learning with us during Key Stage 5. We pride ourselves on our A Level provision and promote the highest aspirations for all our students. This approach has seen students from Meden College regularly secure places at top universities, including Oxford and Cambridge.





Meden School offers a comprehensive programme of enrichment activities enabling students to extend their learning beyond the classroom.

We have access to excellent sports facilities and students enjoy activities including football, hockey, netball, rugby, cross-country, tennis and athletics. Meden students regularly compete at county level and our sports teams have a strong tradition of success.

The Performing Arts take a leading role in school life with regular dance and drama productions, allowing all students to fully explore their creativity.

In addition, we run a wide range of trips and visits, which include residential and international opportunities. In recent years, Meden students have travelled as far afield as France and Taiwan.

TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS

We understand that the transition from primary to secondary education can be both an exciting and a challenging process for both pupils and parents.

Our transition arrangements are carefully planned to ensure that students are ready for a successful and enjoyable Year 7. Arrangements start in Year 5 and build up to a full school visit in the summer term of Year 6. A full programme of activities are offered to all primary schools throughout Year 6.

If you have any questions regarding transition, at any stage of the process, please do not hesitate to ask. Staff are always available to answer questions at the various events or you can e-mail the school at any time.

Meden School is increasingly popular and has become the school of first choice for students from a wide range of primary schools. As well as visiting our linked primary schools, we regularly run information evenings for out-of-catchment parents. Details can be found on our school website. Step One: Summer Term, Year 5

Step Three: Spring Term, Year 6


Data will be collected from the primary feeder schools to help arrange admissions.
